Who was Charlotte Perkins Gilman?

This conference will explore the prolific career of the 20th-century American feminist and socialist Charlotte Perkins Gilman. A prominent author, artist, philosopher and lecturer, Gilman helped shape the cultural conversation on a number of issues, including gender equality, socialism, marriage, birth control, and eugenics, to name a few. Gilman published more than a dozen books and edited her own periodical, *The Forerunner*. This conference gathers academics from around the globe to examine her ideologies and influences on society. A rich selection of Gilman's papers—including letters, drawings, and works from her periodical—will be exhibited as part of the event. A lunchtime presentation will feature the MONK project, a digital environment that helps humanities scholars discover and analyze patterns in texts and handwriting.
