Following the American Humor Studies Association's commitment to addressing the historical, cultural, political, and material dimensions of humor and comedy, this panel welcomes various approaches in the fields of media and cultural studies, literary history and analysis, critical race theories, performance studies, rhetorical studies, and ethnic studies. Papers may examine a range of texts including but not limited to: literature, film, stand up, television, and social media.

The study of comedy and humor invites complex theoretical approaches and areas of interest, including:

- feminist uses of humor and comedy
- humor and affect
- comedic performance and embodiment
- satire and political comedy
- stand-up comedians and their personas
- race and comedy
